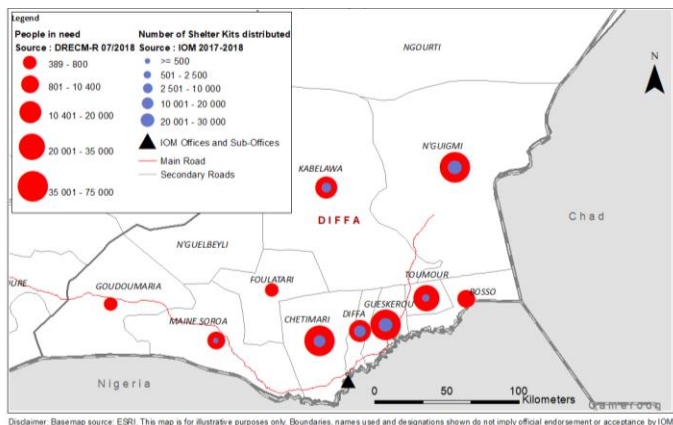


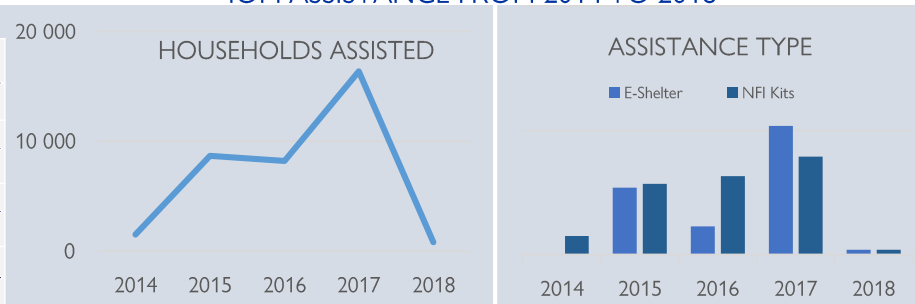
Since 2013, IOM distributes shelter and non-food items to the most vulnerable populations in Diffa. The Boko Haram insurgency forced many thousands of people to leave their area of origin to seek for refuge in more secure sites along the National Highways N°1. Every time movements arise, populations find themselves without adequate shelter or items to meet their basic needs. In an attempt to uphold their dignity and ensure the protection of rights of these populations, IOM in collaboration with the Shelter and Non-food Item Working Group, coordinates the shelter and non-food item response and conducts direct distributions to assist these vulnerable populations. In 2018, IOM reoriented its response from emergency shelter to transitional shelters.
