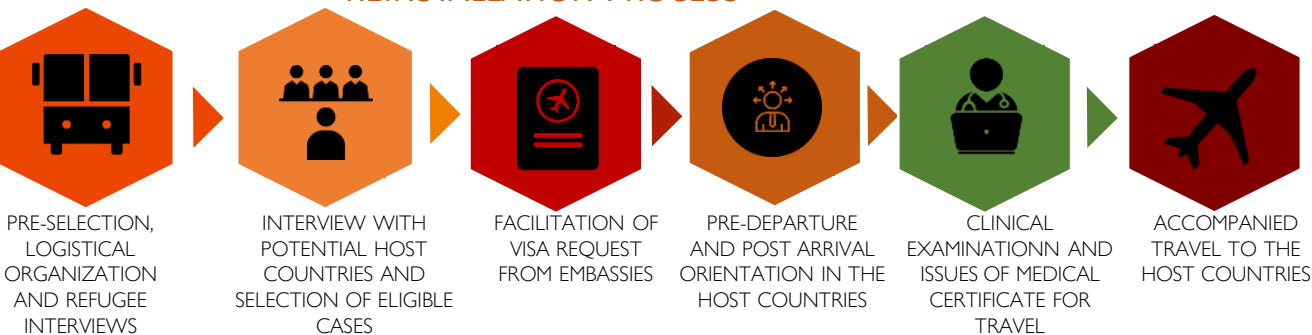


The International Organization for Migration (IOM) in Niger, in collaboration with the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), organizes the resettlement process as a method of protection and a durable solution for the most vulnerable refugees who have taken refuge in Niger. Upon the request of resettlement countries including France, Germany, Sweden, Canada and other countries, IOM provides the following resettlement activities:

- Transportation, escort, accommodation, food and other activities that facilitate the case process as well as interview activities;
- Conduct pre-departure health assessment (medical examination, follow up of cases under treatment and referrals if necessary);
- Awareness-raising on integration including pre-departure orientation and post-arrival information; and
- Local transportation arrangements in the country of asylum (land transport) and/or air transport for the journey to the resettlement country.
